


Synodal Path

Pope Francis has announced that the Church of God is called together in Synod. The path entitled "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission" was solemnly opened last year.





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With this process, Pope Francis invites the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium."

In other words, the Pope wants to consult with us, the People of God, on the future of our Catholic Church and how we walk forward together.

And so there will be a series of meetings for everyone in Church on Wednesdays January 26, February 2 and February 9. Each meeting will commence at 7.30pm and last for about 90 minutes.

Your ideas and experiences matter and each one of us, whether we attend church or not, has an opportunity, guided by the Holy Spirit, for discussing and listening at a very local level. In this way we are making our ideas known to our diocese and thereafter to the Pope. Please come along.

As we embark on this walking and listening, we are asked to focus on 3 key areas:

January 26: Communion – those conversations that will help lead us to a deeper awareness of the life and mission given by Christ.

February 2: Participation – talking and listening to one another about questions that matter.

February 9: Mission – listening, discerning, proclaiming.

These are some, but not all, of the potential questions we might consider on 26 January: Communion

- 1. In what ways does the Catholic Church enhance your life?
- 2. Reflecting on 20 months of the pandemic, how has participation in your parish been affected? Were these issues and/or opportunities there before and how can participation be strengthened moving forward into the future?
- 3. What are the means by which different voices can be heard in your parish (particularly those on the periphery of parish life)? Which groups and individuals are least included in your parish?
- 4. How is the Church perceived by members of your family, your friends and work colleagues?
- 5. How might the Church improve its decision-making processes?
- 6. Which of your concerns does the Church fail or struggle to respond to?


