
Year 2 SATs

Support and Guidance for Parents

What are SATs?

SATs are standardised assessment tests which are administered to Year 2 and Year 6 pupils during the Summer Term. They take place during the month of May.



What is the content of the SATs?

The Year 2 SATs will consist of tests in Reading, Maths and SPaG (spelling, punctuation and grammar).



Reading

The reading test for Year 2 pupils is made up of two separate papers.

- Paper 1 consists of a selection of texts of 400 to 700 words and a set of questions.
- Paper 2 is a reading booklet with various passages of 800 to 1100 words. Answers are written in a separate booklet. There are different question types including multiple choice, labelling, matching, ordering, 'find and copy', short answer and openended answer.





Maths

The Maths assessment will consist of two papers.


- Paper 1 covers arithmetic and takes around 15 minutes.
- <u>Paper 2</u> covers mathematical fluency, problem-solving and reasoning, and takes around 35 minutes.
- There are a variety of question types: multiple choice, matching, true/false, completing a chart/table or drawing a shape. Children are not allowed to use tools such as calculators or number lines during the assessment.



Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar

Children will sit two separate papers in grammar, spelling and punctuation.

- Paper 1 is a 20-word spelling test taking approximately 15 minutes and paper 2 is a grammar, punctuation and vocabulary test, in two sections of around 10 minutes each.
- Paper 2 will involve both selecting the right answers and writing short answers.



What's the Pass Mark?

Once the children have completed the test, the tests will be marked and results converted into a standardised score.

- Less than 100 = Not pass Working Towards the Expected Standard.
- 100 =Pass Expected
- 110 = Pass Greater Depth

Writing

Writing will be assessed through looking at the children's ongoing English work.

What's Important in Writing?

- Handwriting- letters of the correct size and orientation and larger capital letters, attempts to join.
- Capital letters, full stops, exclamation marks and question marks.
- Spelling- any Common Exception Word or High Frequency Word must be spelt correctly. A list has been added into your pack.
- Coherence with a focus on tense, particularly staying in the same tense and using past tense correctly e.g. spent instead of spended.

How are the SATs administered?

We do not want the SATs to be stressful for the children so we try our best to put them at ease. The children will work through the tests in small groups. We will provide the children with drinks, snacks and plenty of breaks.



How can I help my child?

- Our ongoing lessons will help to prepare children for the SATs.
