Dear Parents,

Welcome to Newsletter number 6. We are now in the Season of Advent which is a special time of the year when the Church waits and prepares for the coming of Jesus at Christmas. In our Gospel Assembly next week, we will be speaking to the children about the importance of Advent and what we can do to prepare, including looking at the Advent wreath. Each candle represents a week leading up to Christmas and a candle is lit each Sunday. There are three purple candles, one pink and the final candle is white at the centre of the wreath, to be lit on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day. The first candle that we will light this Sunday, is the "Candle of Hope" and it symbolises faith in God keeping his promises to humanity. The Advent wreath is made of evergreens which symbolises everlasting life and the circle represents God's continuous love. Please continue to talk to your child about the importance of Advent and ask them what they have been doing in class to help them prepare for the coming of Jesus.

They also made 31 Days of Kindness calendars where they wrote 31 kind things that they are going to do throughout December.





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
