Dear Parents,

This Wednesday the children attended our whole school Mass for Ash Wednesday to mark the start of Lent. We would like to say a huge well done to Year 1 and Year 6 who led us so well during the Mass, you read beautifully. Thank you to all of the staff who helped prepare the children so well. Lent

During Lent, the children will be reminded about the importance of fasting, praying and almsgiving, during carefully planned collective worship led by both the staff and the children. Each class will work together to raise money for CAFOD and Father Hudson's. (Obviously we are also completing some charitable work for the Ukraine via the Red Cross - please see letter sent earlier this week.) (As always we encourage children to consider communities both local and globally which, as a school, we can support. Separate class information will be sent out providing more information about this. This will lead up to Holy Week (our last week of term: 4th -8th April) where Year 3, 4 and 5 will lead us through the final events of Jesus' life.

The Book Fayre will be available from Monday -Thursday next week in school from 3:45pm! Please enter via the Studio doors.

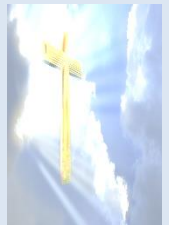
Y1 class assemblies and Y3, Y4 and Y5 Holy Week assemblies take place this half term. Separate information has been sent to relevant classes.
