Religious Education	<p>Easter - look at the accounts of the Resurrection in the four Gospels. Learn about the different reactions of the people to the news that Christ was alive.</p> <p>Pentecost - to study this story and the effects that it had on the disciples. Learn about the missionary activities of the disciples.</p> <p>Sharing in the Life of Christ - Learn about the Universal Church established on the original teaching of the apostles.</p> <p>Special Roles and Responsibilities - the children will learn about the different tasks and responsibilities given to the people in the Church.</p> <p>The units of work above will be covered whilst referring to the UNICEF articles through class discussion.</p>
Maths	<p>Pupils will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Compare numbers with the same number of decimal places up to two decimal places • Round decimals • Recall multiplication facts up to 12 x 12 within less than 5 seconds for each question • To estimate, compare and calculate different measures including money in pounds and pence • To solve problems involving money and measures • To present and interpret discrete data using bar charts, pictograms and time graphs • Identify acute and obtuse angles and order them by size • Compare and classify geometric shapes • Describe positions on a 2D grid as coordinates in the first quadrant
English	<p>Writing Composition</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Horrid Henry - Story with Humour • Fables • Invasion (Recounts and Information Texts) • Poetry (Image Poetry and Narrative Poetry) <p>Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech. • Use apostrophes to mark plural possession. • Use commas after fronted adverbials. • Use a mixture of simple, compound and complex sentences. • To use paragraphs to organise ideas around a theme.
