

## <u>Intent</u>

*"Purpose of study learning a foreign language is a liberation from insularity and provides an opening to other cultures.* A high-quality languages education should foster pupils' curiosity and deepen their understanding of the world" (DfE, 2013:1).

At St Joseph's Catholic Primary school, we believe that learning a foreign language provides a valuable educational, social and cultural experience for our pupils. It helps develop communication skills including speaking and listening and can extend knowledge of how language works. Exploring and learning a language broadens children's minds by encouraging them to understand their own culture and those of others. Thus, teaching a foreign language promotes diversity, tolerance and celebrates difference which encompasses a range of transferable skills to prepare them for life.

## **Implementation**

"The teaching should enable pupils to express their ideas and thoughts in another language and to understand and respond to its speakers, both in speech and in writing. It should also provide opportunities for them to communicate for practical purposes, learn new ways of thinking and read great literature in the original language. Language teaching should provide the foundation for learning further languages, equipping pupils to study and work in other countries" (DfE, 2013:1).

At St Joseph's Catholic Primary School we teach French to our Key Stage 2 children and have four overarching aims: to understand the culture of the countries in which language is spoken; to read fluently; to write imaginatively; and to speak confidently.

To develop teaching and learning of French, we follow the CGP scheme of work and a French teacher from Bishop Walsh Secondary School (part of our St John Paul II Multi- academy) also enriches our curriculum and teaches French once a week to children in UKS2.

This year, we will celebrate Bastille Day (French National day) on 14<sup>th</sup> July. During this exciting day, the children will wear clothes in the colour of the French flag, the children will learn about French history and culture. We hope this day will become an annual event to celebrate French culture.

## Aims of the National Curriculum (2013)

The national curriculum for geography aims to ensure that all pupils:

- understand and respond to spoken and written language from a variety of authentic sources
- speak with increasing confidence, fluency and spontaneity, finding ways of communicating what they want to say, including through discussion and asking questions, and continually improving the accuracy of their pronunciation and intonation
- can write at varying length, for different purposes and audiences, using the variety of grammatical structures that they have learnt
- discover and develop an appreciation of a range of writing in the language studied.
