Q4 -Following last year's results we had 40% of parents who responded don't know about how we as a school we would deal with any incidents of bullying. The following systems were introduced and further explained:

Bullying is taught about through regular assemblies (Gospel values), PSHE lessons and anti-bullying workshops. We promote Kindness Week which takes place every November and refer back to this throughout the year.

An anti-bullying newsletter for parents is sent out annually with a definition of what bullying is and how parents and children can deal with bullying.

School keeps records of behaviour issues between children. Parents and phase leaders are informed of any incidents and these are kept on record so patterns can be analyzed and issues can be followed up.

Our school behaviour policy is promoted in every classroom and we have recently introduced a 'Zones of Regulation' system where children can let staff know of their moods, anxieties and concerns. Staff are able to act on this information 'live'.

We have a 'time out system' where children fill in a reflection sheet to consider the consequences of their actions, how they felt and how they made others feel in order to encourage them to take responsibility for their own actions.

We have an open door policy for parents to meet with the class teacher and follow the system of speaking to the phase leader and then other member of SLT if the issue needs escalating.

We have systems in place to refer children to deal with friendship issues – friendship groups, mentoring, Secure Minds workshops (Yr5/6), etc. As a result of this work this recent Questionnaire has reduced from 40% to 6.6%

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Q5- Following last year's results we noted that 14% of parents responded that they would like more information regarding their child's learning across the year so they can support them at home;

We introduced a brief section on the newsletter every fortnight celebrating and informing of future topics and concepts. We have held a number of parent workshops across the year and have also introduced 'Parent Talks' that were well attended by 50.9%

As a result of this work this recent Questionnaire has reduced from 14% to 5.7%
